Update | Goodwin House Infection Precaution Efforts

Below, please read a letter that we distributed via email to families and friends of Goodwin House Residents on Friday, June 12, 2020.

We're looking forward to what promises to be a beautiful weekend here in Northern Virginia. As we welcome the full arrival of summer, we also celebrate taking the next steps toward the gradual reopening of our region and our campuses.

We shared a reminder of the latest updates to our protocols in this week's Resident Update. Please remember that our protocols are updated as the situation evolves based on guidance from health professionals.

Family & Friend Visits to Independent Living Residents

We welcomed our first visitors this week. Independent Living Residents may now spend time outdoors with family and friends. Visits must be scheduled in advance, and guests must follow our protocols. To make scheduling even more convenient, we have introduced an online booking system.

While we understand everyone is eager to visit their loved ones at all levels of living, current state guidelines allow us only to accommodate limited visits with Independent Living residents at this time.

Testing Options

We've received many questions about how you can access the COVID-19 tests required before a visit with your loved one can be approved. We recommend that you contact your primary care physician (PCP) and explain that you want to visit your loved one in a senior living community and need to be tested. We know some families have had success with this option.

You might also research what your local community might have to offer. Some local governments, such as Arlington County, are offering testing to their residents without requiring a prescription or insurance.
