### **Tracking Vaccine Progress**

Many recent news articles have reported on the progress of COVID-19 vaccines now in clinical trials. The Goodwin House Infection Precaution and Planning (IPP) team is paying attention to these reports to help us develop a thoughtful vaccine protocol. While these vaccines are likely months away, Goodwin House wants to be prepared and ready to make a vaccine available to residents, members and staff when it is safe to do so. We will continue to monitor updates from federal health authorities and are in regular discussions with local health departments about their projections for vaccines and plans to roll them out locally once they are available.

## Are You Ready for Flu Season?

As we prepare for flu season at Goodwin House, we anticipate receiving our stock of flu vaccines in early October. We will move quickly to set up the schedule for making these shots available to all residents and staff. Getting the flu shot is especially important this year, as medical experts expect a surge in both flu and COVID-19 cases in the fall. We strongly encourage that you make your own plans for getting a flu vaccine this year. Check local pharmacies and your primary care practice to see if they will offer flu shots.
