The Pie Man is Here

Remember hovering under our desk in school during Atomic Bomb drills? By the 90s we added fire drills, tornado drills, locker inspections, bomb threats, and "crazy gunmen" lockdowns. Notifying teachers of a lockdown over the loud speaker, but not scaring students, meant having a code word. Teachers would immediately go through the drill—lights out, pull the blinds, cover the door window, lock it, and keep the kids quiet.

The first year we "practiced lock downs" we had a new Spanish teacher, Mary, who had transferred mid-year and had missed our previous practices. One Friday afternoon the announcement came, "The Pie Man is here." Mary immediately went in to action—in Spanish: Lights! Windows! Door! Quiet! The students followed her instructions dutifully, but before long they heard other students outside their room.

Mary slipped out the door to ask her neighbor, me –why there hadn't been an "all clear" announcement.

"Why would we need one?" I asked.

"The code! The Pie Man." She stammered.

"Oh Mary, there really is a Pie Man!" I laughed. "He comes on Fridays, has the most wonderful home made fruit and pecan pies."

I retired in 2000 and began substituting in the high school. Langley was my favorite one. The principal was a former student of mine from 1976. I was a frequent sub and a requested sub in Fashion Marketing (Yes, there is a card game called "Barbie Goes Shopping").

Lockdowns had become almost a monthly practice. I assured the girls that it would "be over my dead body" before a crazed gunman got into our classroom. They assured **me** that they would get behind their tipped-over desks, throw their purses at the gunman, and scream "There's no crying in lockdowns!!"

After President's Day weekend in 2018, I was flying home from my sister's funeral in Florida. The Parkland High School shooting had just happened. I was sitting next to a gentleman who was on his way to a new job here in Virginia. He wanted to know about our schools, especially about how safe his kids would be. All I could assure **him** of was that we'd had lots of practice lockdowns.

I loved teaching and had always said I'd retire when I was tired. But by 80, I was scared. Now, at 84, I am heartbroken again over another school shooting.
