New Music Therapy Tool

At the recent Town Hall, our talented music therapists, Samantha Tedrow and Abigail Hanlon, discussed their work and featured the Crdl, the care instrument designed to create impactful connections between people.

Some residents asked about the cost of the Crdl. With shipping, our costs were approximately \$8,000 and the Foundation budgeted this amount when we were looking at priorities for this year. The first instrument was funded from a bequest that was restricted for the GHBC Terrace; the second instrument was paid for from a restricted fund designated for the GHA healthcare center.

Currently, the instruments are used only in our assisted living, healthcare, and memory support areas. The majority of the funding for music therapy goes to support the salaries of our 2 music therapists and that remains the priority for now, though we aim to add additional instruments and programming as need and funding allows. If I Write It, They Will Read It!: A 93-Year-Old Resident Has Faith in His New Book

Life does not stop when a resident moves to the Health Care Center. The move provided an opportunity for Richard Boeke to continue his work and finish his last book. Richard Boeke and his daughter, Diana, have collaborated on putting together some of his best work over the years. The result is now available online as an e-book or paperback. The title is: Fideology: Building Trust through the Shared Experience of Faith at the Root of the World's Religions. Fideology refers to "faith as trust." The word, coined by Richard, is based on the same Greek roots as fidelity, confidence, and bona fide. Richard credits his teacher Professor Wilfred Cantwell Smith, friend and mentor Huston Smith, and many other faith leaders with much of the inspiration for this book. The book is part personal faith journey, part autobiography, part liturgical service, and part scholarly discourse. This compilation documents a remarkable life's work, weaving the personal, political, and spiritual into a tapestrylike tribute to world peace.

World Music Therapy Week!

April 10th-15th

This year marks the first celebration of World Music Therapy week from April 10th-15th! Music therapy uses evidenced-based music interventions provided by a credentialed music therapist to help individuals achieve specific goals. Goals can include maintaining cognitive and motor functioning, decreasing anxiety and pain, and increasing connection and legacy-building between individuals and their loved ones during end-of-life care.

Music therapy is part of a larger collection of creative arts therapies, such as art therapy and dance/movement therapy. Look for forthcoming monthly articles in the *Gazette* with more information about the other types of creative arts therapy.

To celebrate World Music Therapy week, there will be a music therapy program on April 23rd at 10:30 am in Auditorium-A. Abigail Hanlon will facilitate a music therapy session using instruments, the CRDL (pronounced: cradle), and singing to show how music therapy can benefit several areas of wellbeing! Celebrating Occupational Therapy Month



Did you know April is Occupational Therapy (OT) month? Many people understand what Physical Therapy is but are unsure of what OT entails. OT is a specialty that involves helping people develop, maintain, or recover the skills they need for daily activities that are meaningful and necessary, such as getting dressed, showering, or preparing meals.

One of the toughest parts of aging is losing the ability to do things that once were simple. A big part of an OT's job is to help patients overcome the struggles of daily life. OTs help patients by improving their fine motor skills, strength, dexterity, and range of motion. Even small improvements in these areas can make a difference when it comes to completing a daily task. Additionally, an OT can help with managing pain and recovering from injuries.
